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Diabetes Hope Foundation

Diabetes Hope Foundation (DHF) is a grassroots not-for-profit organization founded by its current chair, Barbara Pasternak, in 1999 after two of her sons were diagnosed with diabetes. The foundation's mission is to provide education and resources to help youth with diabetes transition to a healthier tomorrow.

DHF specializes in developing unique and innovative programming for hard-to-reach teens and young adults living with diabetes. We achieve our mission through a range of virtual programs and digital resources to empower youth with financial support, peer education and resources to transition successfully from pediatric to adult diabetes care.

With a rich history spanning more than 25 years, our programs have been developed in collaboration with a network of over 100 pediatric diabetes clinics from across Canada and an alumni leadership base with 900 young adults with diabetes.

Together, we help post-secondary students pay for tuition and diabetes supplies, prepare youth for transition by matching at-risk teens with mentors in the community, publish free diabetes resources, and provide a forum for youth leaders to share their knowledge.

Support from our community partners, corporate sponsors, and families is critical to our ability to expand our services and respond to emerging community needs. Your support strengthens the development of youth-led programming to empower youth to thrive beyond the clinic, classroom and diabetes.

Our Transition Guide

Our Guide for Successful Transition to College & University was first published in 2013 featuring transition information for 34 Canadian colleges and universities across 5 provinces. Later it was expanded include all accredited schools across the country.

Since the first edition, the guide has been expanded into a comprehensive national guide including fact sheets for 193 accredited colleges and universities across Canada. The current edition is the 8th update from the original Guide for Successful Transition to Colleges and Universities and provides a profile and review of diabetes supports across all post-secondary institutions in Canada.


Last year we completed comprehensive update of the guide and added 8 new pages of alumni insights, new school sheet templates and launched a new mobile app to increase access to our guide. This year's guide also includes more information about mental health supports across Canada, additional information about exam accommodations and remote learning supports available across Canadian colleges and universities.

NEW Mobile App!

In the fall of 2022, we celebrated Diabetes Awareness Month with the launch of our NEW Online Transition Guide for teens and young adults living with diabetes! The guide was developed by type 1 youth for secondary students preparing to transition to adult diabetes care and post-secondary studies.

Designed for busy students on the go, DHF's Online Transition Guide features a searchable database on the home page for students to find their closest diabetes education centre, endocrinologist, campus supports for students with diabetes, and accessibility benefits available at school. We also added quick online links to access mental health support services, health and dental plans available at their choice of college or university, and exam accommodations available through accessibility services.

Diabetes Support Programs in Canadian Schools

The transition to post-secondary education is an incredible milestone in the life of a young adult living with type 1 diabetes. The transition can seem overwhelming for both teens and parents who are trying to balance the financial, emotional and practical elements of going away to college/university and transitioning to adult diabetes care.

Over the last three years, the pandemic has made the transition to college and university more difficult. Since the beginning of the pandemic, 61% of Canadians aged 18-24 have reported a decline in their mental health. Consequently, there has been an influx of private sector and government funding to increase access to mental health and remote learning opportunities.


The primary objective of this guide is to empower students and their parents with information that would help make the transition easier. In particular, additional research was completed this year to increase access to mental health support on campus.

Campus Supports and Services

Colleges and universities across Canada offer a number of healthcare, accessibility and social supports that could help make the transition easier for students with diabetes (see chart on the next page for a breakdown of the availability of these resources).

These supports include:

- Accessibility Accommodations for Student with Diabetes
- Mental Health Support Programs
- Student Health and Dental Plans
- Campus Healthcare Centres
- Campus Pharmacy
- Diabetes Clubs and Social Support Programs
- Remote Learning Accommodations




Support Services Available on College and University Campuses

Accessibility Accommodations


The availability and access to accessibility services are a protected right for students with diabetes (see Section 2 for full details of rights and benefits). These accessibility supports include getting extra time for exams and assignments; having access to dorms closer to campus; taking exams/tests in a different facility or room; getting permission to have a fridge in your room to store your insulin and supplies; arranging different meal plans to better accommodate your diabetes; and/or being allowed to bring food and drinks into the classroom.

Although not every college and university in Canada (96%) has a formal accessibility program in place (see chart below for a breakdown across Canadian schools), every student with diabetes is entitled to ask for these supports, and most colleges and universities would make the accommodations to ensure full access to post-secondary education.



Access to Healthcare Services on Campus


62% of colleges and universities have campus health centres that offer basic medical and emergency services. College/University health centres are a great resource for nutritional information; accessing counseling support; and referral services for students with diabetes.



Mental Health Support Services on Campus

Post-secondary students were among those hit hardest by the COVID-19 pandemic, with social isolation, virtual learning challenges, job insecurity, and financial hardship having a profound impact on their mental health and well-being. In response to unprecedented demand and need for mental health services, private sector and government supports incrementally increased access to mental health services across college and university campuses across Canada during the pandemic.

At the time of our review this June, 86% of colleges and universities offered virtual or on-site mental health counseling, with over 90% of schools in Alberta, Newfoundland, Ontario and Quebec offering on-site and/or virtual mental health services. See below for a regional breakdown:



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Mental health, student health and dental insurance plans, and campus health services are typically covered by compulsory fees built into your tuition fees. Even with an average 8% increase in compulsory fees across the country over the last year, additional funding was needed to support students during the pandemic.

Last year Bell Canada's *Let's Talk* program announced \$1 million in funding to provide telehealth services for 16 post-secondary institutions across Canada. The Government of Canada also invested \$2 million in funding to develop and pilot peer support programs at 5 universities (University of Prince Edward Island, University of New Brunswick, Trent University, Medicine Hat College and University of British Columbia).


At the provincial level, the Ontario government invested \$147 million in funding to support and build upon the province's colleges and universities as part of their Roadmap to Wellness program. In Quebec, \$60 million was allocated in their budget to invest in mental health support for students over the next five years.

However, despite the availability of mental health resources on campus and recent investments, the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations, an advocacy group representing 22 student associations nationwide, reported a staggering three quarters of students experiencing negative mental health during their studies during the 2021-2022 school year.


Access to Diabetes Care

With the exception of universities with medical schools and teaching hospitals on campus, students with diabetes will have to register with a new local diabetes healthcare centre and endocrinologist if they go away to school or transition to an adult diabetes program.


Across Canada, 65% of colleges and universities are located within 5 km of the nearest diabetes healthcare centre, with 80-100% of college/university campuses in Manitoba, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan located within 10 km of the nearest clinic.




Just a little more than half (54%) of the 193 colleges and universities reviewed were located within 5 km of the nearest endocrinologist, with significant variation from province to province. For more details, please refer to individual school sheets that can be found in sections 4 through 12.




There is also significant variation in access to diabetes healthcare between colleges and universities. Across Canada, 68% of universities are located within 5 km of a diabetes healthcare centre and 60% are located within 5 km of an endocrinologist. In comparison, 61% of colleges are located within 5 km of a diabetes healthcare centre, and only 48% are located within 5 km of an endocrinologist.





Remote Leaning During the Pandemic

Lastly, remote learning supports became available during the pandemic with majority of colleges and universities offering online courses, social and mental health supports, and alternative testing/exam formats to protect the health and safety of faculty and students. Even with students returning to school last fall, 60% of the colleges and universities across Canada reviewed have maintained remote learning options and tools for students. Below is a regional breakdown of the availability of remote learning across Canada:




% of Colleges and Universities with Remote Learning

RIGHTS AND BENEFITS

Legal Protections

For Students with Diabetes in Canada

Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms

The Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms; specifically section 15, ensures equality irrespective of race, gender, sexuality and disability, among other factors. The CCRF was signed into law in 1982, with section 15 being brought into force in 1985, unifying Canadians around a principle set of rights and freedoms.

Canadian Human Rights Act

The Canadian Human Rights Act is an extension of the CCRF. It deals with various types of discrimination and serves the purpose of ensuring that everyone is treated equally and justly regardless of age, gender, disability etc. It was also hoped that the enactment of this legislation would reduce and eventually dissolve discrimination in Canada.

United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities

The International Human Rights Treaty is intended to protect the rights and dignity of people with disabilities. Canada, as a signing party, has agreed and is required to promote, protect and ensure human rights and equality for all persons with disabilities in Canada.

Canadian Healthcare System


Canada's Healthcare System

Canada's healthcare system is a group of socialized health insurance plans providing coverage to all Canadian citizens. It is publicly funded and administered on a provincial or territorial basis, within guidelines set by the federal government, through the Canada Health Act.

Canada Health Act

The Canada Health Act is federal legislation that puts in place conditions by which individual provinces and territories in Canada may receive funding for health care services.

There are 5 main principles in the Canada Health Act



Under the health care system, individual citizens are provided preventative care and medical treatments from primary care physicians, as well as access to hospitals, dental surgery and additional medical services. With a few exceptions, all citizens qualify for health coverage regardless of medical history, personal income, or standard of living.

Non-emergency dental services, optometrists, and prescription medications do not legally have to be covered according to the Canada Health Act. Sections 4 through 12 of this guide will include an overview and summary of the health services covered in each province with a list of alternative support programs that residents can opt into for additional health insurance coverage.


Accessibility Supports

For Students with Diabetes in Canada

Some provinces/territories mandate that accessibility plans be in place for students with disabilities. Most colleges/universities, acting in accordance with federal and provincial legislation regarding discrimination have enacted accessibility supports to ensure equality for students with disabilities.

Each post-secondary institution has specific steps in place in order to ensure that necessary accommodations are made for each student. Thus, there are no specifics or limitations to the accessibility supports which can be utilized.

Studying in another Province

Students Temporarily Residing in another Province

Students who wish to travel from their home province to another province will continue to be covered by their provincial health insurance as long as they meet the criteria for continued coverage. To qualify for coverage, students must provide supporting documents to their provincial ministry proving they are full-time students in an accredited school in Canada.

<u>Students! Do NOT Forget!</u> It is imperative to carry and provide your provincial health insurance card when seeking physician services or medical treatment in another province so that your home provincial health insurance can be billed directly.

If no provincial health insurance card is provided at the time services are accessed, **OR** your provincial health insurance is not accepted directly (this may occur when entering/leaving Québec), you will be responsible for paying the bill up front. However, you can fill out a reimbursement form, in which case a portion or all of the expenses incurred will be reimbursed.

Students Permanently Moving to another Province

Students who permanently move to another province must contact their current provincial ministry to make them aware of this change. Their home provincial health insurance will continue to be active for three months out of province; however, once a student arrives to their new home province, they immediately need to register for health care coverage in their new home province.

New provincial coverage becomes active on the first day of the third month following registration. Healthcare insurance cards from your home province must be carried during the time an individual remains uninsured by their new home province in case any medical services need to be utilized.

If no provincial health insurance card is provided at the time services are accessed, **OR** your old provincial health insurance is not accepted directly (this may occur when entering/leaving Québec), you will be responsible for paying the bill up front. However, you can fill out a reimbursement form, in which case a portion or all of the expenses incurred will be reimbursed.

Federal Tax Benefits

Canadian Revenue Agency

Disability Tax Credit (DTC)

A Disability Tax Credit can be claimed by those who need and dedicate time to administering life sustaining therapy, such as insulin.

Medical Expenses Tax Credit

This credit can be applied when medical expenses are over \$2,479 or 3% of your net income or other designated amount (whichever is less).

Refundable Medical Expense Supplement

Refundable Medical Expense Supplement

The Refundable Medical Expense Supplement is available to those who are working and earn less than \$55,449 (2022). Eligible claims are capped at a maximum of \$1,316 if eligible criteria for this credit are met.

Child Disability Benefit

Parents may be eligible for a Child Disability Benefit if their child is under the age of 18 and has not yet filed taxes with the Canadian Revenue Agency.

Registered Disability Savings Plan

A Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP) is a savings plan that is intended to help save for the long-term financial security of a person who is eligible for the disability tax credit.




Alumni Insights – Part One


A. Our Alumni Profile, 2022 Questionnaire




Respondents by Alumni Cohort




Most Important Transition Concerns




Alumni Living at Home vs On Campus









Knowledge of Accessibility Services





In our 2022 Transition Questionnaire, we asked our respondents to provide us with transition tips for type 1 teens. We have organized their tips into the following key areas of interests for youth living with diabetes.

General Tips for Transition to College & University

"It is a very important transition as it will be the beginning of your experience with diabetes as an adult."

"Take time to understand the patterns and changes with your diabetes management and university life."

"Don't be embarrassed of T1D, make it a part of you! Check in with family back home so they don't worry."

 Access to more healthy food Disrupted my routine

"Be prepared for most things to take more effort on your part than it should."

"You won't have everything figured out in your first semester! Do your best, and know that no one else has everything figured out either."

"Educate people on diabetes, most don't have a good idea of what it really is like."

"Stress affects diabetes tremendously so for the sake of your health and grades, do your best to manage your stress."

"Wearing a medical bracelet or necklace is a good discreet way to make sure that your diabetes is known in an emergency, especially if you are surrounded by strangers."

Accessibility Accommodations & Campus Supports

"Talk to people, departments, accessibility services at your university to learn about them - never know when you will need them."

"Push for accommodations even if you think you won't need them, because you will be very grateful when you do. Also don't be afraid to actually use your accommodations."

"There is absolutely zero shame in accessing accommodations at university/college, and doing so early can be super helpful! For example, while I registered for academic accommodations in September of first year, I was not required to apply my accommodations to every single course I took. However, registering at the start of my degree meant that the option was always there in case I wanted to use them."

"Apply for accessibility services with exams - it was a huge help to me."

"If you want to request academic accommodations, you will have to do so early (i.e. often by June or July)."

"Really take some time to talk to your accessibility and health services or any first year mentor you may have (they may be able to connect to a service you might not know about necessarily) to learn about the benefits or supports for you available as a T1 teen."

"Make sure to check what your school insurance covers thought their insurances website! The coverages of supplies may change year to year. Double check what dates the school insurances are extended to - many last until late august."

"Just explain what you're doing to professors if you're low/high in an exam. People still ask if my pump is a pager so there's still misconceptions about medical devices, but just explain what you're doing is for your diabetes, your pump isn't connected to the internet, and your prof will certainly understand."

"Use the available resources to their fullest potential."

Diabetes Management

"It's a really exciting time, you'll learn a lot about yourself and what works/doesn't work for your diabetes management."

"Stay in touch with your doctor to figure out how to adjust insulin depending on situation and how you are feeling."

"You have to be your own advocate and remember that you know your body best. School nurses/doctors can make suggestions for you but this is your body and you're handling the consequences of how it's treated, so don't let anyone force you to respond to your health needs a certain way."

"You will have a different schedule everyday so it is important to check your blood sugar every 2-3 hours and treat it."

"My life got easier when I started preparing more, by making sure I always had my supplies with me. That includes pump supplies, insulin, glucagon, snacks, and anything to treat lows."

"Keep an eye on your supply levels, learn how to ship supplies to where you're living, set up your prescriptions at a local pharmacy before moving, and make sure to request refills about a week before you need them."

"Take time to understand the patterns and changes with your diabetes management and university life."

"Controlling blood sugars will help you focus on your studies."

"Prioritize your mental health and create routine to make your diabetes management easier."

Health and Nutrition

"Do your best to eat well! A poor diet might promote fatigue and can lead to developing bad habits."

"Figure out how your body reacts to certain foods and situations so that you know how to adjust your insulin accordingly."

"Sometimes it's hard to get in proper meals between classes, or plans can change quickly (lastminute study groups, hangouts with friends, etc), so it's always great to be prepared."

"You should take your own food as much as possible and stay active."

"Find ways to exercise, even if its for half an hour a day, it can make a world of difference in the long haul."

"Be careful in the sun and when drinking as your blood sugar will probably drop and fluctuate."

Diabetes Support Network

"Don't be afraid to tell people and ask for help! You're not an inconvenience to anyone."

"Make the most out of your university experience by joining all the groups/activities that interest you. There are so many fun resources available to you at university!"

"Join clubs diabetes, disability or mental health related to learn about different supports out there to help."

"Try to surround yourself with a support system of friends you can rely on. Look for on campus support systems for type 1 diabetics."

"In my experience, everyone who knew I was diabetic was very accepting and accommodating."

"Try and find other diabetics that are in your residence."

"Find a friend or group of people you trust and can fall back on to talk about normal life things outside of school. It really helps to be able to communicate how you're feeling!!"

"I found that keeping in touch with my family and talking to them about my diabetes was very helpful this year, especially as a student away from home. Finding family and/or friends that help me feel grounded allows me to be more open towards facing my challenges as a diabetic, and I am very grateful for everyone in my life who has supported me thus far and gave me an ear to listen to my concerns."

"Whether it's about diabetes or something else, sometimes just talking about it and feeling that support is there for you can be helpful."

Legal Protections For Students with Diabetes in Alberta

Alberta Human Rights Act

The Alberta Human Rights Code is Alberta's amended human rights legislation, which came into effect in October of 2009, with further amendments made in September 2010.

The purpose of this act is to ensure each Albertan receives the same opportunities within the province, without discrimination. The ultimate goal is to ensure equality regardless of race, gender, income, status or class, among other areas.


Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan

Eligibility

All eligible residents of Alberta must register themselves and their dependents with the Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan (AHCIP).

An eligible resident of Alberta is a person who is:

- Legally entitled to be or remain in Canada and makes his/her permanent home in Alberta;
- Committed to being physically present in Alberta for at least 183 days in a 12 month period;
- Not claiming residency or obtaining benefits under a claim of residency in another province, territory or country;
- Any other person deemed by the regulations to be a resident not including a tourist, transient or visitor to Alberta.



Coverage

Other Listed Insured Services

- Examinations and services supplied by persons being paid by the hospital
- Medically required surgery
- Standard Ward Hospitalization, medically necessary use of a semi-private or private room, accommodation and meals
- Necessary nursing service and private nursing care, ordered by the attending physician and meeting the hospital's by-laws

Listed Uninsured Services

AHCIP does not provide coverage for the following:

- Cosmetic surgery, such as tummy tuck, bariatric (lap-band) surgery, and breast reduction unless deemed medically necessary
- Prescription drugs
- Ambulance services (except inter-facility transfers)
- Eyeglasses and contact lenses
- Routine dental care and dentures
- Some immunizations (Contact Alberta Health Services about exceptions)
- Services provided by a chiropractor, acupuncturist, licensed massage therapist, homeopath, naturopath, social worker, nutritionist and physicians' assistant
- Vasectomy reversal
- Clinical psychologist services
- Physiotherapy
- Anaesthetic charges for services not covered by the AHCIP
- Third-party medical services, such as medicals for employment, insurance or sports
- Hearing aids, medical and surgical appliances, prosthetics, supplies, mobility devices, etc.
- Medical advice with a patient by telephone
- Experimental or research program procedures
- Medical-legal services, Medical forms and notes
- Podiatry and optometry services obtained outside Alberta
- Dentistry services obtained outside Alberta, except for medically required oral surgery
- Assisted reproductive technologies, including fertility treatments and in vitro fertilization
- Driver's medical exam for patients 74.5 years of age of older
- Payment for diagnostic imaging referred by chiropractors, physiotherapists and audiologists
- Private and semi-private hospital rooms (unless medically necessary)

Other Benefits and Services

Non-Group Coverage

Non-Group Coverage is a government subsidized drug benefit program available to all residents of Alberta under the age of 65 and their dependents. A monthly premium is charged for Non-Group coverage, and provides access to supplementary prescription drugs not covered by the Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan (AHCIP).

To qualify for this plan, you must be:

- A resident of Alberta
- Under the age of 65 years
- Registered with the AHCIP

Coverage will begin on the first day of the fourth month after Alberta Health receives your application.

A \$50 annual deductible is applied to the total of all eligible health benefit expenses incurred in a benefit year, except for prescription drugs and diabetic supplies.

A co-payment is required for each prescription. A co-payment is the portion of the prescription cost you pay to your pharmacy when you have a prescription filled. The co-payment is 30% to a maximum of \$25. You will not pay more than \$25 for most prescriptions.

Diabetes supplies are covered under this plan up to a maximum of \$2,400 per eligible person each benefit year. Diabetes supplies include needles, syringes, lancets, and both blood glucose and urine testing strips. A co-payment will not be applied to these supplies.

Insulin Pump Therapy Program

The Insulin Pump Therapy (IPT) Program provides funding for the cost of insulin pumps and pump supplies for Alberta residents with Type 1 Diabetes that meet eligibility and clinical criteria.

Eligibility criteria for the IPT program include:

- The patient must be a resident of Alberta who is eligible for coverage under the Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan.
- The patient must have been diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes and be under the care of a physician or nurse practitioner for the condition.
- The patient must meet the clinical criteria established by Alberta Health Services for the IPT Program.
- The patient must follow the steps outlined in the IPT Program for new or existing IPT users.

Legal Protections

For Students with Diabetes in British Columbia

British Columbia Human Rights Code

The Human Rights Code of British Columbia was enacted in 1973, ensuring all people of British Columbia equal rights and opportunities without discrimination in specific areas such as jobs, housing and services. The code's goal is to prevent discrimination and harassment of the basis of such areas as race, colour, sex, sexual orientation, disability, creed and age.

British Columbia Medical Service Plan


Eligibility

Residents of British Columbia are eligible and are required to enroll themselves and their dependents with MSP.

Under the Medicare Protection Act, a resident is defined as a person who meets all of the following conditions:

- Is a citizen of Canada or is lawfully admitted to Canada for permanent residence, makes his or her home in B.C., and
- Is physically present in B.C. at least six months in a calendar year (Jan 1 Dec 31).

Coverage



All medically required services provided by a physician, including Endocrinologists.

Uninsured by MSP. Coverage under Fair PharmaCare Plan.

Coverage of Diabetes Education Teams and Centres.

Dental and oral surgery, when medically required to be performed in a hospital are covered.

- Routine eye examinations for persons 19 to 64 years of age
- Eyeglasses, hearing aids, and other equipment or appliances
- Prescription drugs
- Chiropractic, massage therapy, naturopathy, physical therapy and non-surgical podiatry services (except for MSP beneficiaries with premium assistance status)
- Preventive services and screening tests not supported by evidence of medical effectiveness (for example, routine annual "complete" physical examinations, whole body CT scans, prostate specific antigen (PSA) tests);
- Services of counsellors or psychologists
- Medical examinations, certificates or tests required for: driving a motor vehicle, employment, life insurance, school or university, recreational and sporting activities and immigration purposes

Other Benefits and Services

Fair PharmaCare Plan – Includes Insulin Pump Therapy Program

BC's Fair PharmaCare plan provides B.C. families with coverage for eligible prescription drugs medical devices and pharmacy services. Fair PharmaCare also ensures that B.C. residents, regardless of income, are protected from catastrophic drug costs.


Subject to annual quantity limits, the BC Fair PharmaCare Plan covers test strips, needles and syringes, continuous glucose monitors (CGMs), and insulin. Registered plan members (no age restriction) with type 1 diabetes are also eligible for insulin pump coverage. Both children and adults are eligible for the coverage of insulin and other pump supplies. PharmaCare covers 100% of the cost of one of the approved insulin pumps every five years, subject to the rule of your PharmaCare plan.

All eligible British Columbians are encouraged to register for the plan. Coverage begins as soon as an individual is registered.

There is a deductible for each family/individual, which is based on a net income. After the deductible is reached PharmaCare will cover a certain percentage of all drugs. The percentage covered is also dependent on an annual income.



Legal Protections For Students with Diabetes in Manitoba

Manitoba Human Rights Code

The Manitoba Human Rights Code is the provincial human rights law, which protects individuals and groups in Manitoba from discrimination. It is administered by the Manitoba Human Rights Commission.

The code prohibits unreasonable discrimination in such areas as employment, and accessibility to goods, services, accommodations and facilities. The ultimate goal is to ensure there is equal opportunities in these areas for all Manitoba residents and that people are valued for their own personal merits and not judged in a fashion that would be deemed discriminatory in nature.


Manitoba Health

Eligibility

To be eligible for Manitoba Health, a person must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or Indigenous person;
 - Have Immigration status as outlined in The Health Services Insurance Act:
 - Permanent Residents
 - Work/Study Permit holders and their spouse/dependants (Permit validity periods apply)
 - Convention Refugee
- Establish a permanent residence in Manitoba, and
- Reside (physically) in Manitoba six months in a calendar year

Manitoba Pharmacare Program

Pharmacare is a drug benefit program for eligible Manitobans, regardless of disease or age, whose income is seriously affected by high prescription drug costs.

Pharmacare coverage is based on both total family income and the amount families pay for eligible prescription drugs. The total family income is adjusted to include a spouse and the number of dependents, if applicable.

Each year individuals are required to pay a portion of the cost of your eligible prescription drugs. This amount is their annual Pharmacare deductible. Pharmacare sets the deductible based on the adjusted family income.

Individuals and families qualify for the Manitoba Pharmacare program if they meet all of the following criteria:

- They are eligible for Manitoba Health (MHSIP), Seniors and Active Living coverage.
- Their prescriptions are not covered by other provincial or federal programs.

Manitoba Adult Insulin Pump Coverage Program

The Manitoba Adult Insulin Pump Coverage Program (MAIPCP) provides will cover one approved insulin pump every 5 years as long as the individual meets the eligibility criteria. Insulin pump supplies, such as tubing and reservoirs, are not covered under the MAIPCP.

Insulin pump supplies, along with other consumable diabetes supplies, such as blood glucose test strips and advanced glucose monitors, may be eligible benefits under another federal or provincial program such as, Manitoba's Pharmacare Program.

In order to be eligible for this program an individual must:

- be a Manitoban with an active Manitoba Health Registration number;
- be at least 18 years of age;
- be diagnosed with type 1 diabetes;
- be recommended for insulin pump therapy by an endocrinologist or a physician providing diabetes management care to the individual;
- is currently safely using an insulin pump, or is capable of safely using an insulin pump to assist with managing their blood glucose levels;
- have not received an insulin pump under a Manitoba government funded program within the last 5 years; and
- do not have coverage under a federal program

Legal Protections For Students with Diabetes in New Brunswick

Human Rights Act of New Brunswick

The Human Rights Act of New Brunswick, which is often called the Human Rights Code, is a provincial law that prohibits discrimination and harassment based on 14 personal characteristics in specified activities that fall under provincial jurisdiction. It is the principal legal instrument through which equality rights are enforced in New Brunswick, Canada.

The New Brunswick Human Rights Act applies to private sector businesses and organizations as well as to the provincial and municipal governments. The Act stipulates laws governing accommodations, services and facilities, the leasing of premises; the sale of property; labour unions and professional, business or trade associations; notices and signs; and all aspects of employment.


New Brunswick Medicare and Drug Plans

Eligibility

To be eligible for New Brunswick Medicare benefits you must be:

- A Canadian Citizen or be legally entitled to remain in Canada
- A resident who makes his/her permanent and principal home in New Brunswick (a "resident" means a person lawfully entitled to be or to remain in Canada, who makes his home and is ordinarily present in New Brunswick, but does not include a tourist, transient or visitor to the Province.)

- Services provided by: chiropractors, chiropodists, dentists, optometrists (except as stated previously), massotherapists, naturopaths, orthodontists, osteopaths, pharmacists, physiotherapists, podiatrists, psychologists or private duty nurses

Other Benefits and Services

New Brunswick Drug Plan

The New Brunswick Drug Plan is a prescription drug plan that provides drug coverage for New Brunswick residents without drug insurance. The plan covers drugs listed on the New Brunswick Drug Plan Formulary.

All permanent residents of New Brunswick who have an active Medicare card; do not have existing drug coverage; or whose coverage does not cover a specific drug that is included in the drug plan formulary or the resident has reached their yearly of lifetime maximum for drug coverage, are eligible for this program. Premiums are graduated based on income and members will be required to pay a 30 per cent copayment up to a maximum amount per prescription.

It is important to note that the New Brunswick Drug Plan covers prescription drugs only. Diabetic supplies are not eligible benefits under the New Brunswick Drug Plan formulary; however, insulin is covered, as well as any oral medications used for diabetes management.

Insulin Pump Program (IPP)

The New Brunswick Insulin Pump Program (IPP) supports New Brunswickers living with Type 1 diabetes who are medically eligible for insulin pump therapy. The program seeks to assist individuals in obtaining fair and affordable access to a range of insulin pump devices and the basic operating supplies. The client/family is responsible for a portion of the equipment and supplies based on income. The calculation for the client/family contribution considers information such as household income, family size and the selected device.

New Brunswickers with Type 1 diabetes, will be eligible for funding assistance if they meet the following criteria:

- Must be a permanent resident of New Brunswick with a valid Medicare Number.
- Must already be involved in regular follow up by their diabetes health care team and be reviewed at least 3 times per year and demonstrate a sound knowledge of diabetes self-management.
- Must already demonstrate sound knowledge of carbohydrate counting.
- Must already be practicing self-monitoring of blood glucose, a minimum of 4 times/day (at least before meals and at bedtime) and agree to continue to do as such.
- Must complete an insulin pump educational program given by a certified insulin pump instructor.
- Must be actively attempting to meet and/or maintain the A1c goal that is identified in their care plan.
- Must not have had more than two diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA) episodes in the previous 6 months.

This program does not cover insulin – this is covered through the New Brunswick Drug Plan. Blood glucose test strips, batteries and continuous glucose monitoring systems and supplies are not covered by the program.

Eligible New Brunswickers, who wish to use insulin pump therapy, must meet the medical criteria and complete a IPP Approval Authority Form together with their physician specialist. Only devices included in the Approved Vendor List are eligible for support.



Legal Protections

For Students with Diabetes in Newfoundland and Labrador

Newfoundland and Labrador Human Rights Act

The government of Newfoundland and Labrador introduced the Human Rights Code in 1971, in order to reaffirm the government's faith in fundamental human rights. The Human Rights Code was updated in 2010; a move which the government believed to be imperative in order to reflect the changing times. Added protections were also introduced. These protections include, but are not limited to: prohibited discrimination on the basis of race, colour, nationality, ethnic origin, religious creed, age and disability.

Newfoundland and Labrador Medical Care Plan


Eligibility

Individuals are eligible for the Medical Care Plan (MCP) if their permanent address is in Newfoundland and Labrador. MCP requires documentation to be provided by the applicant to prove eligibility under the plan. Upon registration documentation must also be presented which confirms their citizenship status.

This may include:

- A Social Insurance Card or document containing the applicant's Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- A Canadian passport
- A Canadian Birth Certificate
- An official Federal Government Identity Card or Federal Government document containing the applicant's SIN and name.

The Assurance Plan

This plan offers protection for individuals and families against the financial burden of eligible high drug costs, whether be it from the cost of one extremely high cost drug or the combined cost of different drugs.

Depending on their income level, individuals and families will be assured that their annual outof-pocket eligible drug costs will be capped at either 5, 7.5 or 10 percent of their net family income.

- Those with net incomes up to \$39,999 will pay a maximum of 5 per cent of their net income for eligible drugs.
- Those with net incomes of \$40,000 up to \$74,999 will pay a maximum of 7.5 per cent for eligible drugs.
- Those earning \$75,000 up to \$149,999 will pay a maximum of 10 per cent of their net income for eligible drugs.

The Access Plan

The Access Plan gives individuals and families with low incomes access to eligible prescription medications. The amount of coverage is determined by net income level and family status.

The program is available to:

- Families with children, including single parents, with net annual incomes of \$42,870 or less;
- Couples without children with net annual incomes of \$30,009 or less;
- Single individuals with net annual incomes of \$27,151 or less.

- Oxygen and related equipment and supplies,
- Orthotics such as braces and burn garments, and
- Equipment such as wheelchairs, commodes or walkers.

Newfoundland and Labrador Insulin Pump Program (NLIPP)


The Newfoundland and Labrador Insulin Pump Program (NLIPP) is available to Newfoundland and Labrador residents of all ages who meet medical and financial eligibility criteria. Coverage for the cost of pumps and supplies varies from person to person based on income testing.

This plan includes one insulin pump every 5 years supplies including infusion sets, cartridge/reservoirs and pods and does <u>not</u> cover the cost of insulin or testing strips, continuous glucose monitoring systems, batteries or lost/stolen pumps.

In order to be eligible the following criteria must be met:

- have been diagnosed with type 1 Diabetes Mellitus (T1DM);
- be a resident of Newfoundland and Labrador;
- have a valid medical care plan (MCP) card;
- meet medical eligibility criteria; and
- if 18 years of age or older, meet the requirements for financial assistance through an income testing criteria.

Legal Protections For Students with Diabetes in Nova Scotia

Nova Scotia Human Rights Act

The Nova Scotia Human Rights Act was passed in 1963 in order to protect individuals from discrimination under a number of different areas which include, but are not limited to: age, race, colour, physical disability and mental disability. The Human Rights Act also prohibits discrimination in several areas, including accommodation, employment and in the provision of or access to services or facilities.


Nova Scotia Medical Insurance Service

Eligibility

To be eligible for Nova Scotia Medical Service Insurance (MSI) benefits you must be:

- A Canadian Citizen or "Permanent Resident" (Landed Immigrant)
- A resident who makes his/her permanent home in Nova Scotia and is present in the province 183 days every calendar year.
- Registered with MSI.

Other Benefits and Services

Family Pharmacare

The Nova Scotia Family Pharmacare Program is a provincial drug insurance plan designed to help Nova Scotians with the cost of their prescription drugs. The Program offers protection against drug costs for families who have no drug coverage or if the cost of the prescription drugs becomes a financial burden to them. The Program is available to all Nova Scotians with a valid Nova Scotia Health Card.

If registering as a family, the family will be required to cost share the program. The first 20 percent of every prescription is applied towards their annual family copayment maximum. The remaining 80 percent of the total will be applied against an annual family deductible. When the total deductible is paid, they will continue to pay 20 percent per prescription until their annual copayment is also paid in full.

When both the annual maximum copayment and annual maximum deductible are paid, Pharmacare will pay the approved cost of all medication used, which are covered under the plan, until the end of the program year, which is March 31st.

Insulin Pump Program

The Nova Scotia Insulin Pump Program (NSIPP) provides Nova Scotians living with diabetes with access to treatment options, insulin pumps and pump supplies. To be eligible for the Nova Scotia Insulin Pump Program (NSIPP), you will need to be assessed by a specialized diabetes health care team and to meet specific medical eligibility criteria (see next page for details).

The program is based on family income, and family size. Families with lower incomes will receive the most help through our program. This is to ensure we can help the people who can least afford to pay. To find out if you may be eligible for funding and to calculate your estimated copayment, check out our financial eligibility calculator: <u>https://novascotia.ca/dhw/nsipp/NSIPP-calculator.asp</u>.

Medical Criteria and Confirmation of Eligibility

- Type 1 diabetes diagnosed for at least 4-6 months
- Assessed by NSIPP Diabetes Centre (DC) team
- Attended pump education session for initial application only
- 2 or more DC visits in the last 12 months
- 1 or more A1C result in the last 12 months excluding result at diagnosis Record A1C goal
- Self-monitors glucose 4 or more times per day or uses continuous glucose monitoring (CGM) with at least 70% active time
- No more than 2 diabetic ketoacidosis / hyperosmolar hyperglycemic state (DKA/HHS) episodes in the last 12 months OR If greater than 2 DKA/HHS episodes in the last 12 months, root cause addressed or pump therapy deemed most appropriate

The NSIPP does not cover insulin; oral medication; blood glucose meters, test strips, and lancets; ketone test strips (urine or blood); continuous glucose monitoring systems; batteries; or the cost of lost or stolen pumps or supplies.

Legal Protections

For Students with Diabetes in Ontario

Ontario Human Rights Code

The Ontario Human Rights Code was enacted in 1962. It serves the purpose of preventing discrimination and harassment on the basis of race, colour, gender and disability, as well as several other grounds.

Ontarians with Disabilities Act

The Ontarians with Disabilities Act was established in 2001 and came into force in 2002. It was created in order to improve the identification, removal and prevention of barriers faced by persons with disabilities and to make related amendments to other acts.

The Ontarians with Disabilities Act is also widely known for its regulations on accessibility plans for post-secondary institutions.

Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act

Ontarians with Disabilities Act Committee petitioned the government to revisit the original 2001 Ontarians with Disabilities Act and pass a stronger more efficient act with enforcement, penalties and deadlines. The result was the enactment of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, which was put into force in 2005.


Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP)

Eligibility

To be eligible for Ontario health coverage individuals must:

- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or among one of the newcomer to Canada groups who are eligible for OHIP as set out in Ontario's Health Insurance Act; and
- Be physically present in Ontario for 153 days in any 12-month period; and
- Be physically present in Ontario for at least 153 days of the first 183 days immediately after establishing residency in the province; and
- Make Ontario their primary place of residence.

Coverage



All medically required services provided by a physician, including Endocrinologists.

Uninsured by OHIP. Coverage under MFHP, ODB, TDP and ADP – if eligible.

Coverage of Diabetes Education Teams and Centres. Partial coverage of services provided by Podiatrists.

Dental procedures and services which require hospitalization are covered.

Medically required eye examinations provided by an Ophthalmologist or Optometrist for all those with medical conditions which require regular eye examinations if you are 20-64 years old; including diabetes.

Other Benefits and Services

Ontario Monitoring for Health Program (MFHP)

The Monitoring for Health Program (MFHP) covers 75% of some diabetes supplies, such as blood testing strips and lancets (up to \$950/year) and blood glucose meters (up to \$75 every 5 years). This program is available to all residents of Ontario with a valid OHIP card and have insulin dependent or gestational diabetes; however, individuals registered in the program must not be receiving any other coverage for the supplies being claimed. Trillium Drug Program (TDP)

The Trillium Drug Program (TDP) is intended for Ontarians who have high prescription drug costs in relation to their net household income.

All Ontarians with a valid OHIP card are eligible so as long as they:

- Do not quality for Ontario Drug Benefit program
- Private Insurance does not cover 100% of their prescription drug costs, AND
- Spend about 4% or more of your after-tax income on prescription drug costs

The Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) Program

The Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) Program covers most of the cost of approximately 5,000 prescription drugs for people living in Ontario who are 24 years or younger and not covered by a private insurance plan. The ODB covers insulin and some products used to monitor and test for diabetes, including diabetic testing strips. Syringes, lancets, glucometer and other diabetic supplies are not covered by the ODB.

The Assistive Devices Program (ADP) helps people who have long term physical disabilities get needed equipment and supplies. This program covers 100 percent of the cost of an insulin pump, plus \$2400.00 per year for insulin supplies, full coverage for real-time glucose monitoring system and full coverage for the sensors and transmitters up to a maximum allowable quantity per 24-month period.

To be eligible for this program an individual must:

- Be a resident of Ontario
- Have a valide OHIP recipient with type 1 diabetes
- Get examined by members of a Diabetes Education Program registered with the ADP program.

The Diabetes Education Program will determine if:

- An insulin pump or a real-time continuous glucose monitoring system is appropriate for you
- you meet the medical eligibility criteria for an insulin pump and/or a real-time continuous glucose monitoring system (the medical criteria varies from program to program)



Legal Protections

For Students with Diabetes in Prince Edward Island

Prince Edward Island Human Rights Act

The Prince Edward Island Human Rights Act was first enacted in 1968, guaranteeing both residents and visitors to the province equal treatment regardless of certain identified characteristics (called "prohibited grounds of discrimination").

Administered by the PEI Human Rights Commission, this act ensures discrimination is not present in areas such as, employment and access to accommodations, services, goods and facilities, among others.


Prince Edward Island Hospital and Medical Services Plan (HMSP)

Eligibility

To be eligible for Prince Edward Island Hospital and Medical Service Plan, a person must:

• Be a resident of PEI (a "resident" is defined as anyone who is legally entitled to remain in Canada and who makes his or her home and is ordinarily present, on an annual basis for at least six months plus a day in Prince Edward Island)

Other Benefits and Services

Diabetes Drug Program

The Diabetes Drug Program subsidizes the cost of approved diabetes medication (insulin products, oral diabetes medications, urine testing material and blood test strips) for residents of PEI. This program also approves high cost diabetes medication; however, patients must apply for this on an annual basis and provide income information to the program when applying for coverage on high cost medications.

In order to be eligible to receive benefits from this program an individual must be diagnosed with diabetes, be registered with the Provincial Diabetes Program and must be eligible for PEI provincial health insurance. There is a co-payment schedule for insulin, oral medication and testing materials.

Insulin Pump Program (IPP)

Prince Edward Island Insulin Pump Program allows youth under the age of 25, living with type 1 diabetes with a valid PEI Health Card, to apply for coverage that will assist with the costs associated with insulin pump therapy.

Based on household income and private medical insurance, recipients of this program may qualify for up to 100 per cent coverage to assist with the cost of the pump and monthly pump supplies (including infusion sets, reservoirs, site inserts, skin adhesives and sterile transparent dressings).

To be eligible to be registered in the PEI Insulin Pump Program and receive an insulin pump and pump supplies through the IPP, there are several criteria that must be met, including the following: Individuals must:

- Be diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes for over a year and be under the age of 25
- Be assessed and approved by a Health PEI Diabetes Care Team
- Attend and complete the requirements of the Provincial Diabetes Program's Insulin Pump Therapy Education Program
- Demonstrate competency in carbohydrate counting, sick day and hyperglycemia management, insulin dose adjustment and injection site rotation
- Attend an appointment with a diabetes care team three or more times in the last year prior to initiating insulin pump therapy; with at least one of these appointments be attended in PEI
- Commit to attend three or more follow up appointments per year, with intensive follow ups within the first six weeks after pump initiation
- Commit to self-monitoring of blood glucose a minimum four times a day and act on readings
- Ongoing lab monitoring including three or more A1C tests per year before and after pump initiation.
- Not have more than two episodes of diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA) in the past year

For Students with Diabetes in Québec

Québec Charter of Rights and Freedoms

Québec's Charter of Rights and Freedoms is a statutory bill of rights and human rights code passed by the National Assembly of Quebec in 1975, coming into full effect in1976. The Charter is unique as it covers not only fundamental human rights, but also a number of other important social and economic rights. Furthermore, the list of prohibited grounds for discrimination is quite extensive; a total of 14 prohibited grounds are enumerated.



- Most laboratory services (unless provided in a hospital)
- Certain highly specialized examinations when provided at other than a facility, such as ultrasound (except as part of assisted procreation activities), computer axial tomography (CAT or CT scans) and magnetic resonance imaging (MRIs)
- Orthodontics (e.g. installation of braces)
- Apicoectomies
- Periodontics, i.e. gum treatments and grafts
- Crowns other than prefabricated
- Dental implants, bleaching and veneers
- The purchase, fitting, and replacement of eyeglasses or contact lenses
- Administration of prescription drugs and anesthetics (including ophthalmic drops) during an examination
- Eye examinations required by educational institutions, employers, insurers, summer camps, associations or organizations
- Eye examinations to obtain a licence to drive a passenger vehicle or motorcycle

Other Benefits and Services

Prescription Drug Insurance

*In Québec all residents are required to have private prescription drug insurance.

RAMQ does provide a public plan for those who do not qualify for a private group plan; aged 65 or more; providers of last resort financial assistance (Quebec government program that helps people on low income by providing financial support); or other holders of a claim slip.

People under 65, eligible for a private plan are required to join, at least for the portion of the plan that covers the drugs. Most private plans offer prescription drug coverage along with other services, such as paramedical services or consultations with certain health professionals (chiropractors, physiotherapists, dentists, etc.), but some offer prescription drug coverage only.

Coverage provided may vary from one private plan to another, depending on the agreement entered into between the policyholder and the insurance company or plan administrator.

However, in Québec, all private insurers offering prescription drug insurance must fulfill minimum conditions regarding the coverage they provide and the financial participation they require of the persons they insure.

Insulin Pump Access Program (Programme d'accés aux pompes à insuline)

The Insulin Pump Reimbursement Program is open to all residents of Québec from the ages of 0 to 18 with type 1 diabetes covered by Quebec's public health insurance plan. The program refunds you for the purchase of an insulin pump and supplies needed up to a maximum reimbursement of \$6,300 for an insulin pump every 4 years. A maximum of \$4,000 per year is granted for supplies.

In order to be eligible for the program, the following criteria must be met:

- Blood glucose levels must be monitored before each meal and at bedtime
- Blood glucose levels must be regularly recorded
- The concept of carbohydrate calculations must be mastered and be incorporated into a food plan
- An Insulin pump training program must be successfully completed
- Regular clinic follow-up appointments at least 3 times per year
- Regular attendance in clinic classes to keep an updated knowledge on care

Once admitted, a person is maintained in the program, even after the age of 18, as long as continue to meet the clinic criteria of eligibility. An assessment of eligibility must be made annually.



Saskatchewan Human Rights Code

The Saskatchewan Human Rights Act promotes and protects individual dignity and equal rights in Saskatchewan. Administered by the Human Rights Commission, this Act prohibits unreasonable discrimination in employment, and accessibility to goods, services, accommodations, and education, amongst several other areas.


Saskatchewan Health Services

Eligibility

To be eligible for Saskatchewan Health Services, a person must:

- Be a permanent resident of Saskatchewan
- Be physically present in Saskatchewan six months in a calendar year

Drug Cost Assistance Support Program

The Saskatchewan Special Support Program is an income-based program designed to provide fair access to coverage for prescription drugs. The Ministry of Health determines the eligibility for this program based on the income information provided in the application and the ministry's records.

Saskatchewan Insulin Pump Program

The Saskatchewan Aids to Independent Living (SAIL) Insulin Pump Program was designed to ensure that cost is not a barrier for people who might benefit from insulin pump therapy to manage their Type 1 diabetes. The Insulin Pump Program provides a \$6,300 grant that covers the cost of one insulin pump every five years for eligible individuals.

Program eligibility is based on an assessment through a Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) diabetes education program process, which includes meeting the medical criteria detailed in the Insulin Pump Program policy. An application must be submitted on behalf of a client by an SHA diabetes education program or an authorized diabetes specialist physician

To apply for the Saskatchewan Insulin Pump Program, you must:

- Be assessed by an endocrinologist or a specialist physician who recommend the use of an insulin pump as a medical necessity
- Participate in a regional health authority diabetes education program
- Participate in a regional health authority insulin pump information program



Terms of Reference

Accessibility Services

"Accessibility Services" refers to the specific services available on campus for students with disabilities. The accessibility services staff is comprised of service providers who are uniquely qualified to recommend and provide appropriate accommodations for students who require them while attending their institution.

Accommodations are tailored to each individual who expresses interest in accessing service assistance. Accommodations are made based on the impact of the disability on the student and the unique demands of the post-secondary environment.

Each college/university has their own accessibility service office with their own unique name. In accordance with provincial guidelines, all accessibility service offices strive to provide equal access; educational equity; and positive learning environments for all students with disabilities. Each college/university assists students with disabilities by removing barriers which would cause inequity while students pursue a college/university education.

Blackout Period

A "Blackout Period" refers to a temporary period in which access is limited or denied. In terms of college/university health insurance, a blackout period is that period in which health insurance benefits are valid, but purchases which are covered under the health insurance plan may have to be paid out-of-pocket. Claims can be made to the insurance company after the blackout period; in which case the claims will be reimbursed to the claimant.

Blackout periods typically span anywhere from two to eight weeks, but may go on for longer. The period in which benefits cannot be directly accessed is determined by each individual service provider.

There are a variety of reasons why blackout periods are enacted. For the purpose of college/university health insurance, blackout periods are typically put in place for recordkeeping purposes. During this period insurance companies confirm student enrollment and determine which students require extended health benefits throughout the year (through opt-in and opt-out options during that period).

Co-payment

Otherwise known as a "co-pay", a co-payment is the amount which is paid out-of-pocket by an insured person each time a medical service is utilized or a prescription is purchased. The remaining portion is covered by the insured person's health plan or insurer.

Co-payments vary between individual insurance providers. Information on a specific insurance company's co-payment can usually be accessed on their website or the specific college/university website which the insurance covers services for.

Disability

The term "disability" is an umbrella term, covering impairments that may be physical, cognitive, mental, sensory, emotional, or developmental or some combination of these. A disability may be present from birth, or occur during a person's lifetime. A person with insulin-dependent diabetes is protected as a person with disability under the Canadian Human Rights Act and the Ontarians with Disabilities Act.

Disability is a subjective term, thus, persons with disabilities are those who consider themselves to be, or believe another would be likely to consider them at a disadvantage or at a limitation to others by reason of any physical, mental or other impairment.

Diabetes is considered a disability by most colleges/universities; however it is up to the student to decide whether or not they should disclose their diabetes to their institution and/or to use the accessibility services provided on campus. Not all students will access the services offered by their post-secondary school, however, it is important to note that these services are available if students wish to use them.

Opt-in Period

An "opt-in period" is the period in which an enrolled student can choose to add additional family members to their school's extended health benefit plan.

Although most post-secondary institutions automatically enroll registered students into a health benefit plan, this is not always the case. For those schools which do not have automatic enrollment, this period is also the time where registered students of an institution can enroll themselves into a health plan if they require it.

Opt-out Period

An "opt-out period" is the period in which an enrolled student can choose to decline health benefits from their institution's health insurance provider. Usually students who have alternative extended health coverage will choose to opt-out of the services offered by their post-secondary health insurance. Students who opt-out must complete a form or online document which confirms their decision to decline health insurance from their school's provider and also confirm their alternate health coverage.

Reasonable Accommodation

In context of this book "reasonable accommodation" refers to a modification or adjustment to an academic program, course or physical facility made by the post-secondary institution. It is these modifications or adjustments that enable an otherwise qualified student with a disability, access to or participation in post-secondary sponsored programs. These modifications do not alter the fundamental purpose of the academic program or course.

Reasonable accommodations are determined on an individual basis and must relate to the student's specific functional limitations within the academic setting. Accommodations may vary from class to class depending upon course content and format.

Accommodations are decided upon by those uniquely qualified service providers which are staffed by the institution. In order for reasonable accommodations to be made, a student must disclose their condition to those staff members of their post-secondary institution's accessibility centre. Accommodations may not always be exactly to the student's wishes or requests. Moreover, reasonable accommodations are subject to the institution's capacity to respond to the request.

Federal and Provincial Statutes

Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms

Equality before and under law and equal protection and benefit of law

15. (1) Every individual is equal before and under the law and has the right to the equal protection and equal benefit of the law without discrimination and, in particular, without discrimination based on race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, sex, age or mental or physical disability.

Affirmative action programs

2) Subsection (1) does not preclude any law, program or activity that has as its object the amelioration of conditions of disadvantaged individuals or groups including those that are disadvantaged because of race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, sex, age or mental or physical disability.

Canadian Human Rights Act

2. The purpose of this Act is to extend the laws in Canada to give effect, within the purview of matters coming within the legislative authority of Parliament, to the principle that all individuals should have an opportunity equal with other individuals to make for themselves the lives that they are able and wish to have and to have their needs accommodated, consistent with their duties and obligations as members of society, without being hindered in or prevented from doing so by discriminatory practices based on race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, family status, disability or conviction for an offence for which a pardon has been granted or in respect of which a record suspension has been ordered.

Denial of good, service, facility or accommodation

5. It is a discriminatory practice in the provision of goods, services, facilities or accommodation customarily available to the general public

(a) to deny, or to deny access to, any such good, service, facility or accommodation to any individual, or

(b) to differentiate adversely in relation to any individual, on a prohibited ground of discrimination.

Definitions

25. "<u>disability</u>" means any previous or existing mental or physical disability and includes disfigurement and previous or existing dependence on alcohol or a drug;

United Nations Convention on the Rights for Persons with Disabilities

Article 1

Purpose

The purpose of the present Convention is to promote, protect and ensure the full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms by all persons with disabilities, and to promote respect for their inherent dignity. Persons with disabilities include those who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others.

Article 2

Definitions

"Discrimination on the basis of disability" means any distinction, exclusion or restriction on the basis of disability which has the purpose or effect of impairing or nullifying the recognition, enjoyment or exercise, on an equal basis with others, of all human rights and fundamental freedoms in the political, economic, social, cultural, civil or any other field. It includes all forms of discrimination, including denial of reasonable accommodation;

"Reasonable accommodation" means necessary and appropriate modification and adjustments not imposing a disproportionate or undue burden, where needed in a particular case, to ensure to persons with disabilities the enjoyment or exercise on an equal basis with others of all human rights and fundamental freedoms;

Article 24 Education

1. States Parties recognize the right of persons with disabilities to education. With a view to realizing this right without discrimination and on the basis of equal opportunity, States Parties shall ensure an inclusive education system at all levels and lifelong learning directed to:

The full development of human potential and sense of dignity and self-worth, and the strengthening of respect for human rights, fundamental freedoms and human diversity;

The development by persons with disabilities of their personality, talents and creativity, as well as their mental and physical abilities, to their fullest potential; Enabling persons with disabilities to participate effectively in a free society.

2. In realizing this right, States Parties shall ensure that: Persons with disabilities are not excluded from the general education system on the basis of disability, and that children with disabilities are not excluded from free and compulsory primary education, or from secondary education, on the basis of disability; Persons with disabilities can access an inclusive, quality and free primary education and secondary education on an equal basis with others in the communities in which they live; Reasonable accommodation of the individual's requirements is provided; Persons with disabilities receive the support required, within the general education system, to facilitate their effective education; Effective individualized support measures are provided in environments that maximize academic and social development, consistent with the goal of full inclusion.

3. States Parties shall enable persons with disabilities to learn life and social development skills to facilitate their full and equal participation in education and as members of the community. To this end, States Parties shall take appropriate measures, including: Facilitating the learning of Braille, alternative script, augmentative and alternative modes, means and formats of communication and orientation and mobility skills, and facilitating peer support and mentoring;

Facilitating the learning of sign language and the promotion of the linguistic identity of the deaf community; Ensuring that the education of persons, and in particular children, who are blind, deaf or deafblind, is delivered in the most appropriate languages and modes and means of communication for the individual, and in environments which maximize academic and social development.

Alberta

Alberta Human Rights Act

Preamble

WHEREAS it is recognized in Alberta as a fundamental principle and as a matter of public policy that all persons are equal in: dignity, rights and responsibilities without regard to race, religious beliefs, colour, gender, physical disability, mental disability, age, ancestry, place of origin, marital status, source of income, family status or sexual orientation;

Discrimination re goods, services, accommodations and facilities

4. No person shall

(a) deny to any person or class of persons any goods, services, accommodation or facilities that are customarily available to the public, or,

(b) discriminate against any person or class of persons with respect to any goods, services, accommodation or facilities that are customarily available to the public,

because of the race, religious beliefs, colour, gender, physical disability, mental disability, ancestry, place of origin, marital status, source of income, family status or sexual orientation of that person or class of persons or of any other person or class of persons.

British Columbia

British Columbia Human Rights Code

(3) The purposes of this Code are as follows:

(a) to foster a society in British Columbia in which there are no impediments to full and free participation in the economic, social, political and cultural life of British Columbia;

(b) to promote a climate of understanding and mutual respect where all are equal in dignity and rights;

(c) to prevent discrimination prohibited by this Code;

(d) to identify and eliminate persistent patterns of inequality associated with discrimination prohibited by this Code;

(e) to provide a means of redress for those persons who are discriminated against contrary to this Code; (f) and (g) [Repealed 2002-62-2.]

Discrimination in accommodation, service and facility

(8) (1) A person must not, without a bona fide and reasonable justification,

(a) deny to a person or class of persons any accommodation, service or facility customarily available to the public, or

(b) discriminate against a person or class of persons regarding any accommodation, service or facility customarily available to the public because of the race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation or age of that person or class of persons.

Manitoba

Manitoba Human Rights Code

"Discrimination" defined

9(1) In this Code "discrimination" means

(a) differential treatment of an individual on the basis of the individual's actual or presumed membership in or association with some class or group of persons, rather than on the basis of personal merit; or

(b) differential treatment of an individual or group on the basis of any characteristic referred to in subsection (2); or

(c) differential treatment of an individual or group on the basis of the individual's or group's actual or presumed association with another individual or group whose identity or membership is determined by any characteristic referred to in subsection (2); or

(d) failure to make reasonable accommodation for the special needs of any individual or group, if those special needs are based upon any characteristic referred to in subsection (2).

Interpretation

9 (1.1) In this Code, "discrimination" includes any act or omission that results in discrimination within the meaning of subsection (1), regardless of

(a) the form of the act or omission; and

(b) whether the person responsible for the act or omission intended to discriminate.

Applicable characteristics

9 (2) The applicable characteristics for the purposes of clauses (1)(b) to (d) are

(a) ancestry, including colour and perceived race;

(b) nationality or national origin;

(c) ethnic background or origin;

(d) religion or creed, or religious belief, religious association or religious activity;

(e) age;

(f) sex, including sex-determined characteristics or circumstances, such as pregnancy, the possibility of pregnancy, or circumstances related to pregnancy;

(g) gender identity;

(h) sexual orientation;

(i) marital or family status;

(j) source of income;

(k) political belief, political association or political activity;

 (I) physical or mental disability or related characteristics or circumstances, including reliance on a service animal, a wheelchair, or any other remedial appliance or device;
 (m) social disadvantage.

Discrimination in service, accommodation, etc.

13 (1) No person shall discriminate with respect to any service, accommodation, facility, good, right, licence, benefit, program or privilege available or accessible to the public or to a section of the public, unless bona fide and reasonable cause exists for the discrimination.

New Brunswick

Human Rights Act of New Brunswick

(2) The following definitions apply in this act:

"Physical disability" means any degree of disability, infirmity, malformation or disfigurement of a physical nature caused by bodily injury, illness or birth defect and any degree of paralysis or from diabetes mellitus, epilepsy, amputation, lack of physical coordination, blindness or visual impediment, deafness or hearing impediment, muteness or speech impediment, or physical reliance on a guide dog or on a wheelchair, cane, crutch or other remedial device or appliance.

Discrimination in accommodation and services

6 (1) No person, directly or indirectly, alone or with another, by himself, herself or itself by the interposition of another, shall, because of race, colour, religion, national origin, ancestry, place of origin, age, physical disability, mental disability, marital status, sexual orientation, sex, social condition or political belief or activity,

(a) deny to any person or class of persons any accommodation, services or facilities available to the public or,

(b) discriminate against any person or class of persons with respect to any accommodation, services or facilities available to the public.

Newfoundland and Labrador

Newfoundland and Labrador Human Rights Act

2. In this Act

(c) "disability" means one or more of the following conditions:

(i) a degree of physical disability,

(ii) a condition of mental impairment or a developmental disability,

(iii) a learning disability, or a dysfunction in one or more of the processes involved in understanding or using symbols or language, and

(iv) a mental disorder;

(d) "discrimination" includes the conduct described in subsections 11 (1) and (2) and 12 (1), section 13, subsections 14 (1), (4) and (5) and 16 (1), sections 17 and 18, subsection 19 (1) and section 20;

Prohibited grounds of discrimination

9. (1) For the purpose of this Act, the prohibited grounds of discrimination are race, colour, nationality, ethnic origin, social origin, religious creed, religion, age, disability, disfigurement, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, family status, source of income and political opinion.

(2) Where this Act protects an individual from discrimination on the basis of sex, the protection includes the protection of a female from discrimination on the basis that she is or may become pregnant.

(3) Where this Act protects an individual from discrimination on the basis of disability, the protection includes the protection of an individual from discrimination on the basis that he or she

(a) has or has had a disability;

(b) is believed to have or have had a disability; or

(c) has or is believed to have a predisposition to developing a disability.

(4) Where this Act protects an individual from discrimination on the basis of a prohibited ground of discrimination, it also protects the individual from discrimination on the basis of

(a) 2 or more prohibited grounds of discrimination or the effect of a combination of prohibited grounds; and

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(b) the individual's association or relationship, whether actual or presumed, with an individual or class of individuals identified by a prohibited ground of discrimination.

Goods, services, accommodation and facilities

11. (1) A person shall not, on the basis of a prohibited ground of discrimination,

(a) deny to a person or class of persons goods, services, accommodation or facilities that are customarily offered to the public; or

(b) discriminate against a person or class of persons with respect to goods, services, accommodation or facilities that are customarily offered to the public.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), a limitation, specification, exclusion, denial or preference because of a disability shall be permitted where that limitation, specification, exclusion, denial or preference is based upon a good faith qualification.

(3) Subsection (1) does not apply

(a) to accommodation in a private residence, except a private residence that offers bed and breakfast accommodation for compensation;

(b) to the exclusion of a person because of that person's sex from accommodation, services or facilities upon the ground of public decency;

(c) to accommodation where sex is a reasonable criterion for admission to the accommodation;

(d) to a restriction on membership on the basis of a prohibited ground of discrimination, in a religious, philanthropic, educational, fraternal, sororal or social organization that is primarily engaged in serving the interests of a group of persons identified by that prohibited ground of discrimination; or

(e) to other situations where a good faith reason exists for the denial of or discrimination with respect to accommodation, services, facilities or goods.

(4) Subsection (1) does not prohibit the denial or refusal of accommodation, services, facilities or goods to a person who is less than 19 years of age where the denial or refusal is required or authorized by another Act.

(5) For the purpose of this section, "accommodation, services, facilities or goods to which members of the public customarily have access or which are customarily offered to the public" include accommodation, services, facilities or goods that are restricted to a certain segment of the public.

Nova Scotia

Nova Scotia Human Rights Act

Purpose of Act

(2) The purpose of this Act is to

(a) recognize the inherent dignity and the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family; (b) proclaim a common standard for achievement of basic human rights by all Nova Scotians;

(c) recognize that human rights must be protected by the rule of law;

(d) affirm the principle that every person is free and equal in dignity and rights;

(e) recognize that the government, all public agencies and all persons in the Province have the responsibility to ensure that every individual in the Province is afforded an equal opportunity to enjoy a full and productive life and that failure to provide equality of opportunity threatens the status of all persons; and

(f) extend the statute law relating to human rights and provide for its effective administration. 1991, c. 12, s. 1; 2008, c. 59, s. 1.

Interpretation

(3) In this Act,

(I) "physical disability or mental disability" means an actual or perceived

(i) loss or abnormality of psychological, physiological or anatomical structure or function,

(ii) restriction or lack of ability to perform an activity,

(iii) physical disability, infirmity, malformation or disfigurement, including, but not limited to, epilepsy and any degree of paralysis, amputation, lack of physical co-ordination, deafness, hardness of hearing or hearing impediment, blindness or visual impediment, speech impairment or impediment or reliance on a hearing-ear dog, a guide dog, a wheelchair or a remedial appliance or device,

(iv) learning disability or a dysfunction in one or more of the processes involved in understanding or using symbols or spoken language,

(v) condition of being mentally impaired,

(vi) mental disorder, or

(vii) dependency on drugs or alcohol;

Discrimination Prohibited

Meaning of discrimination

(4) For the purpose of this Act, a person discriminates where the person makes a distinction, whether intentional or not, based on a characteristic, or perceived characteristic, referred to in clauses (h) to (v) of subsection (1) of Section 5 that has the effect of imposing burdens, obligations or disadvantages on an individual or a class of individuals not imposed upon others or which withholds or limits access to opportunities, benefits and advantages available to other individuals or classes of individuals in society. *1991, c. 12, s. 1.*

Prohibition of discrimination

5 (1) No person shall in respect of

(a) the provision of or access to services or facilities;

(b) accommodation;

(c) the purchase or sale of property;

(d) employment;

(e) volunteer public service;

(f) a publication, broadcast or advertisement;

(g) membership in a professional association, business or trade association, employers' organization or employees' organization,

discriminate against an individual or class of individuals on account of

(o) physical disability or mental disability;

Ontario

Ontario Human Rights Code

Freedom from Discrimination

Services

1. Every person has a right to equal treatment with respect to services, goods and facilities, without discrimination because of race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, ethnic origin, citizenship, creed, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, marital status, family status or disability. R.S.O. 1990, c. H.19, s. 1; 1999, c. 6, s. 28 (1); 2001, c. 32, s. 27 (1); 2005, c. 5, s. 32 (1); 2012, c. 7, s. 1.

Accommodation

2. (1) Every person has a right to equal treatment with respect to the occupancy of accommodation, without discrimination because of race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, ethnic origin, citizenship, creed, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, marital status, family status, disability or the receipt of public assistance. R.S.O. 1990, c. H.19, s. 2 (1); 1999, c. 6, s. 28 (2); 2001, c. 32, s. 27 (1); 2005, c. 5, s. 32 (2); 2012, c. 7, s. 2 (1).

Disability

17. (1) A right of a person under this Act is not infringed for the reason only that the person is incapable of performing or fulfilling the essential duties or requirements attending the exercise of the right because of disability. R.S.O. 1990, c. H.19, s. 17 (1); 2001, c. 32, s. 27 (5).

Ontarians with Disabilities Act

2. (1) In this Act,

"agency" means an organization or a class of organizations named or described in the regulations as an agency or agencies for the purposes of this Act; ("organisme")

"barrier" means anything that prevents a person with a disability from fully participating in all aspects of society because of his or her disability, including a physical barrier, an architectural barrier, an information or communications barrier, an attitudinal barrier, a technological barrier, a policy or a practice; ("obstacle")

"disability" means,

(a) any degree of physical disability, infirmity, malformation or disfigurement that is caused by bodily injury, birth defect or illness and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, <u>includes diabetes mellitus</u>, epilepsy, a brain injury, any degree of paralysis, amputation, lack of physical co-ordination, blindness or visual impediment, deafness or hearing impediment, muteness or speech impediment, or physical reliance on a guide dog or other animal or on a wheelchair or other remedial appliance or device,

(b) a condition of mental impairment or a developmental disability,

(c) a learning disability, or a dysfunction in one or more of the processes involved in understanding or using symbols or spoken language,

(d) a mental disorder, or

(e) an injury or disability for which benefits were claimed or received under the insurance plan established under the *Workplace Safety and Insurance Act, 1997*; ("handicap")

Educational institutions and hospitals

15. (1) Each year, every Scheduled organization shall,

(a) prepare an accessibility plan; and

(b) consult with persons with disabilities and others in preparing the plan. 2001, c. 32, s. 15 (1).

Contents

(2) The accessibility plan shall address the identification, removal and prevention of barriers to persons with disabilities in the organization's by-laws, if any, and in its policies, programs, practices and services. 2001, c. 32, s. 15 (2).

Same

(3) The accessibility plan shall include,

(a) a report on the measures the organization has taken to identify, remove and prevent barriers to persons with disabilities;

(b) the measures in place to ensure that the organization assesses its proposals for by-laws, policies, programs, practices and services to determine their effect on accessibility for persons with disabilities;

(c) a list of the by-laws, policies, programs, practices and services that the organization will review in the coming year in order to identify barriers to persons with disabilities;

(d) the measures that the organization intends to take in the coming year to identify, remove and prevent barriers to persons with disabilities; and

(e) all other information that the regulations prescribe for the purpose of the plan. 2001, c. 32, s. 15 (3).

Availability to the public

(4) A Scheduled organization shall make its accessibility plan available to the public. 2001, c. 32, s. 15 (4).

Guidelines for accessibility plans and policies

18. (1) The Government of Ontario shall specify guidelines for the preparation of accessibility plans and policies under this Act, and may establish different guidelines for ministries, municipalities, organizations specified by a regulation made under clause 23 (1) (g), public transportation organizations, Scheduled organizations, agencies and other persons or organizations to follow in preparing their accessibility plans or policies. 2001, c. 32, s. 18 (1).

Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act

Purpose

1. Recognizing the history of discrimination against persons with disabilities in Ontario, the purpose of this Act is to benefit all Ontarians by,

(a) developing, implementing and enforcing accessibility standards in order to achieve accessibility for Ontarians with disabilities with respect to goods, services, facilities, accommodation, employment, buildings, structures and premises on or before January 1, 2025; and

(b) providing for the involvement of persons with disabilities, of the Government of Ontario and of representatives of industries and of various sectors of the economy in the development of the accessibility standards. 2005, c. 11, s. 1.

Content of standards

(6) An accessibility standard shall,

(a) set out measures, policies, practices or other requirements for the identification and removal of barriers with respect to goods, services, facilities, accommodation, employment, buildings, structures, premises or such other things as may be prescribed, and for the prevention of the erection of such barriers; and

(b) require the persons or organizations named or described in the standard to implement those measures, policies, practices or other requirements within the time periods specified in the standard. 2005, c. 11, s. 6 (6).

Compliance with accessibility standard

13. A person or organization to whom an accessibility standard applies shall comply with the standard within the time period set out in the standard. 2005, c. 11, s. 13.

Accessibility report

(1) 14. (1) A person or organization to whom an accessibility standard applies shall file an accessibility report with a director annually or at such other times as the director may specify. 2005, c. 11, s. 14 (1).

Report available to public

(1) A person or organization shall make an accessibility report filed under subsection (1) available to the public. 2005, c. 11, s. 14 (2).

Prince Edward Island

Prince Edward Island Human Rights Act

1 (1) In this Act:

(c.1) "disability" means a previous or existing disability, infirmity, malformation or disfigurement, whether of a physical, mental or intellectual nature, that is caused by injury, birth defect or illness,

and includes but is not limited to epilepsy, any degree of paralysis, amputation, lack of physical coordination, blindness or visual impediment, deafness or hearing impediment, muteness or speech impediment, or physical reliance on an assist animal, wheelchair or other remedial device;

(d) "discrimination" means discrimination in relation to age, colour, creed, disability, ethnic or national origin, family status, gender expression, gender identity, marital status, political belief, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or source of income of any individual or class of individuals.

Discrimination prohibited

2 (1) No person shall discriminate:

(a) against any individual or class of individuals with respect to enjoyment of accommodation, services and facilities to which members of the public have access; or

(b) with respect to the manner in which accommodations, services and facilities, to which members of the public have access, are provided to any individual or class of individuals.

Québec

Québec Charter of Rights and Freedoms

Discrimination forbidden

10. Every person has a right to full and equal recognition and exercise of his human rights and freedoms, without distinction, exclusion or preference based on race, colour, sex, pregnancy, sexual orientation, civil status, age except as provided by law, religion, political convictions, language, ethnic or national origin, social condition, a handicap or the use of any means to palliate a handicap.

Discrimination defined

Discrimination exists where such a distinction, exclusion or preference has the effect of nullifying or impairing such right.

Saskatchewan

Saskatchewan Human Rights Code

Interpretation

2(1) In this Act:

(d.1) "disability" means:

(i) any degree of physical disability, infirmity, malformation or disfigurement and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes:

(a) epilepsy;

(b) any degree of paralysis;

(c) amputation;

(d) lack of physical co-ordination;

(e) blindness or visual impediment;

(f) deafness or hearing impediment;

(g) muteness or speech impediment; or

(h) physical reliance on a service animal, wheelchair or other remedial appliance or device; or (ii) any of:

(a) an intellectual disability or impairment;

(b) a learning disability or a dysfunction in one or more of the processes involved in the comprehension or use of symbols or spoken language; or

(c) a mental disorder

Right to Education

13(1) Every person and every class of persons shall enjoy the right to education in any school, college, university, or other institution or place of learning, vocational training or apprenticeship without discrimination on the basis of a prohibited ground other than age.

(2) Nothing in subsection (1) prevents a school, college, university or other institution or place of learning from following a restrictive policy with respect to enrolment on the basis of sex, creed, religion or disability, where it enrols persons of a particular sex, creed or religion exclusively, or is conducted by a religious order or society, or where it enrols persons who are disabled.

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
